PRAYER DIARY

Monday 29th: In-between 2025 and 2026 think about the blessings in your life. What are you most thankful for? Why not pray and thank God for it. Ask God to make us more aware of his grace in our lives and to be more thankful.

Tuesday 30th: Many of us know the blessings of family and friends. Take some time to reflect on how people closest to us impact us. How do we impact them? Then pray that God would make us good for each other; that we would be instruments in his hands that make us all kinder, gentler, more graceful, and more like Jesus.


